What Brings Clark Gable To The Vallejo Yacht Club

A couple months back, shipmate Barbara Brown said she had something for me to put in our VYC history archives. She gave me this photo and paper to go with it. Barbara tells me that this photo was

given to her from her friend Laurie Johnson. Laurie was going through her mother's things, and in one of the boxes a photo surfaced. She wasn't sure who was in the photo, so she decided to post it on Facebook, but the photo appeared to be blurry and unclear. Laurie also noticed in the background, the Vallejo Yacht Club sign. By not getting any good responses, she gave the photo to Barbara because she knew that Barbara was a yacht club member. Thus, starts the search of this mysterious photo.

The Vallejo Museum was contacted and Noble (Barbara's husband) gets an email reply message from the Museum Curator, Jim Kern. The message reads as follows: "Here's what we have at the Museum on Clark Gable. We don't always find the answer so fast, so it's nice when we do!" What was found was a Times Herald article dated Friday, January 16, 1998, written by Marion Devlin. She recalls the day of her meeting and spending the afternoon with him, thus the following article was created:



"I hope you agree with me that good things...and good memories...bear repeating. Because the event I'm recalling gave me column material almost 58 years ago, and I find myself smiling as I remember 'The Day I Met Clark Gable!'

Without a doubt he was the handsomest, the most charming of movie stars, and today when I catch a rerun of one of his old films, I find myself smiling back at him and recalling every detail of that fateful day.

It was in 1940, and Gable had been spending a few days in Napa to be near his wife, Carole Lombard, who was making the film, "They Knew What They Wanted" with Charles Laughton. Those fortunate enough to have met Gable there gave rave reports; he was so friendly, so obviously in love with his wife.

So it was a pleasant surprise that Monday morning when Orvin Gaston, editorial head of our newspaper, received a phone call from an old Napa friend to say that he and Gable were going fishing that day outside the Golden Gate. He told Orvin that Gable was so friendly and outgoing that if Orvin

cared to have a reporter at the Vallejo Yacht Club, where they would be in an hour or so, he was sure the star would agree to an interview. How I was lucky enough to be chosen for that assignment I'll never know, but believe me I was grateful.

Orvin decided to go with me and when we drove up to the entrance to Vallejo's old yacht club there stood Gable, handsomer than anyone has a right to be, staring at our Vallejo hills and smiling that Gable grin.

'I like this place,' he enthused. 'It reminds me of home. Wish I had time to see more of it.'

At that point his Napa friend came out and joined us. 'Well you can take an hour to see it,' he told Gable. 'I'll be tied up here that long and then we'll get to the fishing.'

Gable smiled, but said without a car there wasn't much he could do. And then I amazed myself by saying: 'Well, I have a car, and if you like, I'll give you a short tour.'

Without delay he was sitting alongside me in my dusty little Chevrolet. Orvin slid into the rumble seat, and we took off... along the channel, then up Georgia Street as I indicated points of interest, driving as slowly as possible in hopes we'd be recognized.

We parked in front of the Times-Herald business office on Marin Street and I walked in with Clark Gable....well, I still tingle when I think about it. That Gable grin and charm captivated everyone. He signed autographs, he inquired about newspaper equipment, and he made us all feel like kings and queens for a day.

Then someone from the PG&E office, which was right next door, came in to see if it really was Clark Gable there with us, and to ask if he would drop in there too. He would and he did, and then it was time to take him back to the Yacht Club and take off on that fishing trip.

My longtime friend, Louise Stevenson, added a postscript to my Gable story. She was at home that morning when her friend Helen Scofield, called from the PG&E office to tell her of their distinguished visitor. She told Louise he was about to leave for the Yacht Club but if she hurried she might catch a glimpse of him. And hurry Louise did, in time to meet Gable, who flashed the famous grin and signed her autograph 'To Louise.' Then she returned home to face the hanging garage door minus its hinges, and her husband Jack's reaction to her

carelessness. Louise said that through the years he enjoyed reminding her of the damage she wrought in her eagerness to meet her idol. It was well worth those hinges, wasn't it Louise?"

One of the other papers Barbara gave me was a copy of a photo of Dr. Ervin Casper. It reads: "In 1940, while acting as Commodore of the Vallejo Yacht Club, Ervin hosted movie stars Clark Gable and Carole Lombard on his boat before the pair took 'a casual stroll up Georgia Street,' according to the

Times-Herald."

Thank you Noble and Barbara for bringing this piece of VYC history to us. I think this is one of my most exciting and interesting article that I have ever written. I am happy to share this with all my fellow shipmates here at VYC.

SAFETY REPORT



A quick response saves lives. Practicing quick responses prepares us for emergencies. We must be prepared for the winter months.

Man overboard scare sparks sea search in English Channel.

A "massive search" was launched to find a passenger who was reported missing from a ferry in the English Channel. A witness said they saw someone go overboard from the Pride of Kent ferry about six miles off the coast of Dover at about 01:30 GMT. HM Coastguard initially said it was searching for a missing woman but later said all crew and passengers had been "accounted for safe and well". The search for the missing passenger was stood down after eight hours.

A spokeswoman for HM Coastguard said, "The area has been extensively searched overnight and into this morning with nothing found. All crew and passengers, including the woman believed to be missing, have been accounted for safe and well".

"However, a witness on board the ferry insists they saw someone go overboard. HM Coastguard described the operation as a "massive search". A helicopter from Lee-on-Solent was scrambled, four lifeboats from Dungeness, Dover, Walmer and Calais, and a tugboat from the Port of Dover were launched after the passenger was reported missing in the early hours.

Portadown: Elderly woman is rescued from sinking car

A woman's car became submerged in a slipway of the River Bann in Portadown. Four men have been praised for saving the life of the woman as her car sank in the River Bann in County Armagh. Ryan Cummins was passing by a slipway of the river in Portadown on a Friday evening when he and others heard the trapped woman screaming for help.

They waded into the river and pulled her to safety, as her car became fully submerged. Mr. Cummins cannot swim. Firefighter Andy Black said the men "acted extremely bravely" and "undoubtedly saved this lady's life". The woman, who is believed to be in her 70s, received medical treatment at the scene.

Mr. Cummins, 25, said, "We arrived and there was a car already half-submerged in the water." He said he could hear the woman calling for help out of her car window and described hearing her screams as "horrific". "Myself and a couple of others ran up to the main road to get help and no one would stop. We ran back down, and at that stage the car was totally submerged, and the next minute the woman popped her head up out of the water.

He then stripped off and waded into the water to rescue the woman. His friend, Glen Martin, and other men linked arms, forming a human chain to the river's edge so the fast-moving current would not sweep them all away. They managed to pull her out of the river, just as fire crews and police arrived at the scene.

I propose late this winter and early spring we begin safety courses to promote good procedures and prompt responses to events and situations to make us safer. If you have safety ideas, courses, or teachers, please put it writing and email or hand it to me.

The Perils of Black Ice

As once again winter approaches in Vallejo, the same safety issues raise their ugly head. Rain, fog and cold weather create a recipe for danger and disaster. Danger is the ice, especially on the head walks in front of south dock which remain in the shade during the winter months. The disaster(s) occur with the sudden impact from the slip and falls. Black ice is invisible, especially in the shade. So be vigilant and report any ice on the head walks.

To be safe out there is to practice being safe.

PICYA REPORT

VYC Delegate Maggie Sabovich, Commodore Mark Bauder and Vice Commodore John Cole attended the annual November PICYA Awards Dinner at the Encinal Yacht Club, where Commodore Bauder accepted the PICYA Award for 2014 Club of the Year on behalf of the Vallejo Yacht Club, as the VYC earned more than the 250 points required to reach Five Star Club of the Year status for the year 2014! Mark, John and Maggie also earned the VYC four points for their attendance. This year, three other PICYA member clubs also earned five star status. They are Encinal Yacht Club, Richmond Yacht Club and Oakland Yacht Club, so all four will share the large silver Club of the Year trophy.

The first PICYA sponsored event with the opportunity to earn 2015 COTY points was the Fall Management Conference, which was held at the Richmond Yacht Club on Saturday, October 18th. There was an opportunity to earn 15 Club of the Year points for attendance at this event, with 2 points earned per Club Officer or Director, 3 points for each Club Officer-Elect or Director-Elect for 2015, 2 points per PICYA OYC delegate, and 1 point for each club member attending.

Attending were Commodore Elect Mark Bauder, Vice Commodore Elect John Cole, Staff Commodore Elect John Van Vessem, Director Elect Bill Zerby, VYC Manager Johnathan Douglas and PICYA Delegate Maggie Sabovich, which earned the OYC the 15 Club of the Year points possible to start the 2015 COTY point year off with a bang!

The next opportunity for the VYC to earn 10 COTY points is the submission of the PICYA Yachting Yearbook fleet, member and officer data and photos by the announced deadline to the current PICYA yearbook publisher, Patti Mangan. Patti told me informally at the Encinal meeting that the deadline for that information should be by the end of the year, rather than the November 15th date that had been established by the previous Yachting Yearbook publisher. I received an email from her that earlier would be better, but for point count purposes, Dec. 31st, 2014 stands. The following PICYA event where Club of the Year points may be earned is the PICYA Commodore's Ball and Installation of Officers which will be held at the St. Francis Yacht Club on Saturday, January 24th beginning with cocktails at 5:30 PM, dinner at 7 PM, and Installation of 2015 PICYA new officers at 8 PM. Reservations must be made by January 10th, 2015. The cost is \$80.00 per person, and PICYA will be subsidizing another \$15.00 of that amount, as the St. Francis quoted us a price of \$95.00 per person. There is an opportunity to earn 6 Club of the Year points for the attendance of an VYC current Club Officer and 4 points for the attendance of the PICYA Delegate/Club member.

PICYA's next regular monthly meeting will be Monday, February 2nd at the Benicia Yacht Club, as there are no meetings in December and the Installation of Officers is in January.

RBOC: There is an opportunity for the VYC to earn five Club of the Year points for mailing or emailing 10 responses to the first RBOC Call to Action of the year, which addresses the infestation of the water hyacinth into many of our Delta waterways, to the point where private boats and large ships cannot negotiate their way into either their harbors or into the port of Stockton. RBOC UPDATE & CALL TO ACTION - DELTA

November 15, 2014

RBOC is urging boaters to immediately contact their elected representatives, urging them to take emergency action to address the infestation of invasive water hyacinth that is blocking waterways in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta with devastating impacts on boating recreation as well as marine-related businesses. States RBOC President Karen Rhyne: "We are hearing many excuses on why water hyacinth has taken control of the Delta, from the drought increasing water temperatures, to delayed permit approvals for critical spraying, to fast-approaching deadlines for spraying to be completed. The Delta boating community needs to hear that the state is acting with urgency and with dedication, and that the state is committed to resolve this disaster as soon as possible."

Key point for your contacts:

0.I urge you to press the state agencies including the Natural Resources Agency to act with urgency and with dedication, and a commitment to resolve the water hyacinth infestation disaster in the Delta. It should be noted that State Senator Cathleen Galgiani [D-Stockton] is working with other Delta legislators to schedule a panel discussion on December 15 to identify actions that can be taken to address the water hyacinth infestation. RBOC has advocated consistently for sufficient boater funds to be dedicated by the state to timely efforts to prevent the spread of this water hyacinth and other invasive species. The state Division of Boating and Waterways within State Parks has a leadership role, and is authorized to spend boater-generated taxes and fees for this program. However, the infestation this year is the worst in memory, with boats unable to leave their slips, waterways completely blocked, and marina businesses brought to a standstill. The Delta ecosystem is placed at risk with native wildlife starved of oxygen. Water usage, especially for agriculture, can be diminished with clogged water infrastructure. Continues President Rhyne: "RBOC is engaged with other stakeholders and organizations, as well as elected officials at all levels of government, in an effort to develop a short-term resolution as well as to establish a structure to prevent this situation from occurring in the future."

RBOC is the nonprofit advocacy organization that works to protect and enhance the interests of the state's recreational boaters before the legislative and executive branches of state and local government. RBOC is in its 46th year as a statewide organization promoting the enjoyment, protection, and responsible use of our waterways.

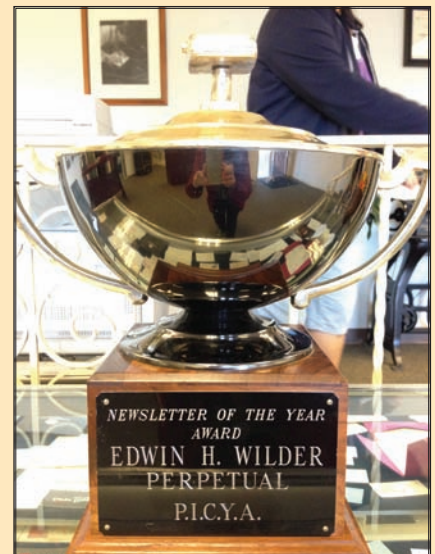
